



A note from our founder, Jeff Devoll -

Zambia is considered to be generally safe. Like any developing nation, demonstrations and other activities do happen, but they are not generally violent. In my travels to Zambia, I have never felt unsafe while there and do not know of anyone who has participated who has felt unsafe. It is one man's opinion and travel/construction/activities carry inherent risk, but we do our best to keep people safe. Reach out to me personally with your concerns - I'll chat with you.

Nicaragua has been generally peaceful for some time, despite protests at times. We have plans in place in the event of a natural disaster or other event. Tourism is a huge industry in Zambia due to Victoria Falls and abundant wildlife including more than 2500 lions.

All participants should check with their doctor for recommended medications before traveling to Zambia and Malaria medical is highly recommended.

All participants are required to have medical and evacuation insurance (provided by uReach at a low daily cost) even though it has never been needed in 25 years of leading teams. That's how seriously we take your safety.
